#### THE PECK FAMILY

by William Greer Peck, 5705 Rosario, Atascadero, California 93422.

The author begins by pointing out that there are two different lines of Pecks that were pioneers to America -- the English Pecks from London and the German Pecks from Ebingen, Germany. This book deals with the German line.

The author depicts each ancestor in short biographical sketches giving dates of birth, death, marriage, etc. so other researchers may trace their own lines thru those listed. The sketches begin with Hans Beck born in 1513. He died of bubonic plague March 13, 1593.

The first Peck to come to America was Johann Jakob Beck Jr. born July 7, 1723. He died in Virginia in 1800. He changed his name from Beck to Peck to eliminate the confusion caused by the German pronunciation of Beck to sound like Peck in English.

The line is carried thru David S. Peck who came to Tennessee about 1837. He died in Davidson Co., Tenn. in 1843. After his death his wife moved with her children to Robertson Co.

Related families also included in this book are Balthrop, Crutcher, Goetz, Greer, Head and Rosson. Descendants of these families are brought down to the present generations. Descendants are found not only here in Montgomery Co., Robertson Co., and near by areas, but are scattered from California to Florida.

The book contains a full name index and many pictures of the families.

This 170 page book is a bargin at \$15.00. A researcher would have to spend this much, if not much more, on postage alone, not to mention the untold hours of work, to amass the information contained in this volume. Mr. Peck should be commended for doing such an excellent job.

# SOLDIERS FROM MONTGOMERY CO., TENNESSEE REVOLUTIONARY WAR and the WAR OF 1812

On the 1840 census of Montgomery Co. Tenn. is Alexander Frazier, age 81, and living in the household of Sol Neville. He is a pensioner of the

Revolutionary War.

In Old Grant's Chapel Methodist Church cemetery is this stone: "Alex Frazier, died Aug 23, 1841, aged 84 yrs. A Revolutionary Soldier. Erected by Mary Grant." This cemetery is located in District 5 in the Port Royal Community on Grant's Chapel Road. from CEMETERY RECORDS OF MONTGOMERY CO., TENN. Vol 1, page 2.

# BENJAMINE HERRING WAR of 1812

Benjamin Herring died Oct. 14, 1860, age 71 yrs. War of 1812 (old news-paper)

He was the son of Bright and Susan Herring. Will of Bright Herring names son, Benjamin Herring. Will Bk E. page 256-57. (Wills and records of Montgomery County, Tenn.)

The 1850 census of Montgomery Co., Tenn. lists:

Benjamin Herring born in N. C. age 60 11 " Tenn 51 Rachel 11 " Tenn Cathrine J. " 24 77 " Tenn 73 78 21 Simion B. 11 " Tenn Edwin R.

Benjamin Herring was born in North Carolina May 9, 1790 and died in Montgomery Co., Tenn. Oct 14, 1860. His wife was Rachel Neville Whitefield, born Nov. 5, 1796 and died Feb 11, 1887. (from the papers of Miss Eddie Barnett of Clarksville, Tenn., a great-granddaughter of Benjamin Herring.

The old Herring cemetery is on the farm of James Walker on the Trenton Rd. All of the stones are gone except two small field stones. Only these small stones and two very old cedar trees are left to guard this spot. Mr. Willie Herring of Waco, Texas told me that in 1955 there were some twelve graves there and the markers were all piled up in a heap on the edge of the cemetery.

One of the children of Benjamin Herring was Ann who married Henry Jefferson Davis. They are buried in the church cemetery at Little Hope Baptist Church in District 11. Ann S. Davis Jan 24, 1818--Sept 25, 1890, wife of Jefferson Davis. Henry J. Davis - Sept 20, 1813 - Dec 24, 1868. There were twelve children born to this marriage, the parents making fourteen in the family. On their stone is a chain with fourteen links and each link is broken. As each member of the family died, a link in the chain was broken. (We saw that the links were broken and the desendants told me the story)

#### WILLIAM BAKER--War of 1812

Noncupative will of William Baker died on or near the city of Ner Orlean in the service of U. S. Vol. on 21st Jan. 1815--proven by Andrew Davis and John Mitchel. He names his mother, Ann Baker, and brothers James and Robert Baker.--proven 19 April 1815. (Will Book B, page 258, Wills of Montgomery Co. Tenn.

Inventory of William Baker estate-James Baker is administrator. April 1818. (Will Book A. Page number missing. AWD)

JOHN OGBURN (1797 - 1853) was a soldier of the War of 1812 serving under General Green. He was the son of Matthew H. Ogburn who came from Virginia to Montgomery County, Tennessee with his family where he lived and died. John Ogburn married Mary Hunt daughter of William A. Hunt and they had eight children, one being Samuel D. Ogburn who was born May 27, 1833. (Hale and Merrett Vol. IV page 1125-1126)

#### HENRY MCFALL - War of 1812

Henry McFall served as a soldier during the Mexican War being a major under General Jackson at the battle of New Orleans (Hale and Merrett Vol. VI, page 1136.)

Henry McFall of Prince Edward County, Virginia married Zaney Nolen who was born in 1787. There were five children: Eliza, Robert H., born Dec 8, 1816, Mary J., Sallie A. F., and Samuel J. who died April 24, 1850 (Goodspeed History of Tennessee page 1071)

Henry McFall married Zanzy Nolen April 19, 1814 - Robert Nolen security (Old marriages of Montgomery County, Tenn.)

#### Tate Odon: al- War of 1812

Tate Odencal made a Noncupative Will 5th day of Jan. 1815 not long before he expired - about one hour. Names mother Sarah Odencal; four sisters and one brother but not named (Will Book B, page 57 Montg. Co.)

Sarah Odeneal administratrix of Tate Odeneal - Jan. term 1816 - Also Robert Edmondson (Will Book B, page 311)

Tate Odeneal is on the list of Captain Smith's Co. from the Natchez Expedition.

Deed of Gift from Sarah Odeneal to daughters, Lucy Grant and Wilmouth Edmondson and son, Tate Odeneal for negroes and furniture. Made July 2, 1810. Test. A. Peterson and Jno. Edmonson (Will Book A. Page 363)
