Ordered that a road be layed off the nearest and best way from Clarks-ville to Hayden Well's mill to McAdoo Creek and that William Baker, Timothy Anderson, Jr., William Peary, Haydon Wells, John Harris, David Rudder, Charles Miles, Alexander Carns be appointed to view and mark the same, and that Robert Kirkpatrick be appointed overseer on said road and that his hands be as follows to wit- William Perry, Samuel Perry, Jesse Cooksey, Stephen Owens, Bright Lacy, Hayden Wells hands. John Harris, David Reeder, Timothy Anderson, Sen., Jonathan Anderson, Bright Baker, Nicholas Baker, James Boyd hands work under said Robert Kirkpatrick on said road.

On the bench the worshipful Morgan Brown, Robert Prince, Joseph Robertson, James Stewart, Shadrick Tribble, Haydon Wells, James Huling, James Lockert, Benjamin Weakley, Samuel Gattis and David Prichard, Esq.

Motion on petition of William Gordon to have an order made in s'd court to recend an order made in favor of Peter Brawner for keeping a public ferry across the Rivers Cumberland and Red at the junction. The court took into consideration the matter and orders that the said order be and is hereby recended and abolished and that the said William Gordon have licenses to keep a public ferry (p42) across Cumberland and Red River at the junction. He gives Robert Nelson and James Stewart Esq. his securities bound in the sum of two thousand dollars.

Ordered that a road by layed out and viewed from the court house in Clarksville the nearest and best way to the best ford near the mouth of Red River to intersect the Blooming Grove Road and that John McCarrell be overseer of said road. Viewers William Lyons, Elisha Willis, John McCarrell, Robt. Prince, Henry Samll, James McCarrell, Andrew Creswell, James Elder, Jr., R. McFarland and Sam'l Criswell.

Ordered that Thomas Johnston, agt. for James G. Braham, be released from the taxes due on 4480 acres of land lying on the waters of Yellow Creek for the year 1805, it appearing to the satisfaction of the court that s'd land lies in Dickson County. That the sherriff have a credit with the State Treasurer and County Treasurer for the same.

8 Deed of Conveyance Man Phillips to James Bailey was acknowledged in open court and ordered to registration for 330 acres of land.

9 Deed of Conveyance Jonathan Phillips to John Rudolph was acknowledged in open court for 400 acres of land.

10 Deed of Conveyance Robert Nelson to James Trice was acknowledged in open court for 201 acres of land and ordered to registration.

11 Deed of Conveyance Eneas McAllister by Hugh F. Bell, attorney in fact to James Trice was proven in open court by the oaths of Robert Nelson and John Hust subscribing witnesses there to for 274 acres.

13) Bill of sale - Wright Outlaw to Elisha Channell for one Negro girl was proven in open court by the oath of Solomon Scott a subscribing witness there to and ordered to registration.

14 Deed of Conveyance - William Ryburn to William McDaniel was acknowledged in open court and ordered to registration for 165 acres of land.

A receipt George W. Neville in favor of John Cocke, sherriff of Montgomery Co., dated Mar. 25, 1806 was acknowledged in open court for one hundred and ten dollars.

15 Deed of Conveyance - James Edmondson to John Edmondson was proven in open court by the oaths of Robert Edmondson and John Baly subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to registration for 257 acres of land.

On motion it is ordered that the County Taxes for the year eighteen hundres and six be one half of the State Taxes.

Court adjourned until tomorrow at 9 o'clock.

The Worshipful Court of Montgomery County have met according to adjournment, Wednesday, March 26th 1806. Present the Worshipful Morgan Brown, Robert Prince, and Samuel Gattis, Esqs.

James Moore returns the list of taxable property of Captain Samuel Crafts Comp'y for the year 1806/ by Morgan Brown/.

Joseph Woolfolk Esq. returns a list of taxable property for Captain Stephenson's Company for the year 1806.

Shepherd & Co. vs Mosses Ferguson - Case. John Burger proves eleven days as a witness, 160 miles riding and four ferriges and is allowed agreeable to him.

Adam Shephard & Co. vs Morgan Brown - Covenant. Agreed on both sides to try Tomorrow Morning.

5) Henry Minor Esq. produced a liscense from the Judges of the Supreme

Court as an attorney at law. Took the necessary oaths of qualification.

Hugh McClure returns a list of the taxable property for the Town Company for the 1806 by Capt. McClure.

N. McGraw vs B. Weakley - Gabriel Allen proves as a witness two days, 26 miles riding and two ferriges and is allowed agreeable to law.

N. McGraw vs W. Weakley - Gabriel Allen proves as a witness two days, 26 miles riding and two ferriages and is allowed agreeable to law.

Lewis Elliott vs Morgan Brown - Appeal. Thomas Tomkins a witness in this suit was solemnly called and came not. Therefore he is fined according to law - Issue Sipa.

Lewis Elliott vs Morgan Brown - appeal. Fredrick Hyer a witness proves two days attendance and two ferriges. John W. Souther, a witness proves three days attendance. Lewis W. Elliott a witness proves three days attendance and two ferriges.

6) Where as it appears that a number of lots in Clarksville was reported for the year 1803 as not being given in for taxes and it also appearing that Martin Armstrong was the propietor of the said lots who resides in Nashville in the District of Mero which said property reported was directed to be published in the Knoxville Gazette which was published twice contrary to the Act of Saaembly. On motion ordered that the fees appear to be due to the printer of Knoxville or unnecessary tax thereon be struck out of each execution issued on each lot and that the Sheriff be directed not to pay the same if they are recieved by him to the said printer & it also appearing that B. J. Bradford, the printer in Nashville published the said lots aforesaid once more than was necessary which the sheriff also is directed not to pay him the said if he has recieved them. (The above order is recended.)

N. McCraw vs B. Weakley - Jacob Lewis proves as a witness three days and 20 miles riding and is allowed agreeable to law.

N. McCraw vs W. Waekley - Jacob Lewis proves as a witness three days, 20 miles riding and is allowed agreeable to law.

W. Farrin vs John McConell - cost. Bryant Whitfield proves as a witness three days and is allowed agreeable to law.

7) L. Hall vs M. Phillips - case. John Elliott as a witness two days this term and four ferriges is allowed agreeable to law.

William Rayburn vs Morgan Brown & Clement McDaniel - The plaintiffs attorney dismisses this suit and Morgan Brown on of the defendants comes into court and assumes all costs but the plaintiff's attorney fee. Judgement accord.

GEORGE NEVILLE - REVOLUTIONARY WAR

George Neville was in the 1st Regiment Continental Dragoons of Virginia. He was a Lt. Col. at the close of the war. He served until the end of the war.

George Neville was born in 1734 in Prince William Co., Va. He died 1811 in Montgomery County, Tennessee. On 26 March 1762 he married Rachel Earle of Westmoreland Co., Va., the daughter of Maj. Samuel Earle III and his wife Anna Sorrell who was the daughter of Thomas Sorrell and his wife Elizabeth O'Conney of Frederick Co., Va.

George Neville received a grant of 640 acres on Red River in what later became Montgomery Co. (This was on April 29, 1789-Davidson Co., Tenn. Reg. of Grants - Book A, page 330, Grant #173)

ABEL JOHNSON - REVOLUTIONARY WAR

Abel Johnson born 1760, place of birth not certainly established. (possibly North or South Carolina). His place of residence during the Revolutionary War was Johnson County, N. C. He died 1830 in Montgomery Co., Tenn. He was married in 1805 to Curtis Frazier who was born 1780, South Carolina; died 1855, Montgomery Co., Tenn.

Abel Johnson bought land from John Jefferies in Montgomery Co., Tenn. 1821. The boundry lines and the neighbors put this land in either District #4, which is now in the Camp area or in District #9, which is across the road from the camp. He should have been buried on his land but we have never found his grave.

ZACHARIAH HARVEY - WAR OF 1812

Will of Zachariah Hervey (Harvey) made Dec. 9, 1814 proven April term 1815 by David Vaughn, John Wedlue and James Brady.
A Volunteer in Captain Robert Edmondson's Company of Tennessee Volunteers mounted gunman- taken sick in Ammit (Armit?) County, Mississippi. Will mentions "my brothers and sisters" but does not name them. Will Book B, page 255, Montgomery Co., Tenn.

Dec. 10, 1814 Zachariah Harvey dec'd. (The McCutchen Trace by Hilgard Smith, page 124.)

2. EVANS WAR OF 1812

? Evans came to Tennessee from Virginia and was killed in the War of 1812.

He had a son, Hugh Evans, who married Sallie (Chisnan). Hugh Evans had seven children: 1. Leigh W. Evans born 1834 2. W. L. Evans born Oct. 15, 1832. 3. Mary F. Evans 4. Sallie A. Evans 5. Carolina Evans 6. Ross Evans and 7. Amos Evans. (Goodspeed's HISTORY OF TENNESSEE, page 1029 - 1030)

Hugh Evans did not marry Sallie Chisnan. He married Sallie Chisenhall the daughter of Reuben and Jane (Leigh) Chisenhall. Jane was the daughter of Richard and Rachel (Bingham?) Leigh. Reuben Chisenhall was the son of Alexander Chisenhall. (from my Leigh papers. AWD)

Hugh and Sallie Evans are buried in the Liberty Church Cemetery in Dist. #8. Hugh Evans born Dec. 12, 1807 died Jan 28, 1874.
Sarah B. Evans wife of Hugh Evans was born Feb. 25, 1805 and died Oct. 30, 1870.
