"I have no verry particular remarks to make as it respects the sickness in my county the last year onding the first of June 1850. There has been no particular malady in my county. Chills and fevers is more common than any other disease. The water in my county generally lime-stone. We have a variety of soil and rocks and also the groth generall is oak, hickory, popular, black gum, sweet gum and some few Black Jack, sassafras, chestnut, black and white walnut and cherry. There is several kinds of the maple sugar elm and all most any kind of groth of timber that grows in Tennessee. ROBERT ARMSTEAD - REVOLUTIONARY WAR

Robert Armstead is buried in the Mount Pleasant Methodist Church Cemetery in District 8 of Montgomery County, Tenn. about 10 miles northwest of Clarksville off Highway 79.

On one stone is: ROBERT ARMSTEAD June 29, 1761 - Sept. 8, 1853 A Revolutionary Soldier. MARY A., wife of Robert Armstead, May 19, 1776 - March 18, 1853.

Another stone is: Robert Armstead Jan. 4, 1804 - June 26, 1867

Will of Robert Armstead made Oct. 1846 - Rend. Oct 1853 mentions wife, Mary.

Sons: John, Robert, Richard A., and Jesse

Daughters: Polly T., Betsy Ford, formerly Betsy Frazier.

Children of daughter Betsy by first husband, James Frazier, to wit:

Henritta, Rosanna, and Elizabeth Frazier.

Children of daughter Mary Goodwin

Granddaughter Harriet, daughter of son Richard and Harriet, his wife.

SAMUEL SMITH - REVOLUTIONARY WAR

Samuel Smith is buried in the Smith cemetery near the site of Old Asbury Church. This is now in Fort Campbell, Kentucky. The last land owner was G. M. Smith. It is located on Engineer Road.

His stone reads: Samuel Smith died Jan. 16, 1837 age 75 yrs. A Soldier of the Revolutionary War.

Another stone reads: Wiley Smith born in Granville Co., N. C. died Oct. 10, 1872 - Age 74 yrs.

There is a Griffith grave, Fuqua and two Smiths (from Cemetery Records of Fort Campbell, Kentucky.)

JESSE COOKSEY WAR of 1812

Jesse Cooksey born in Va. 1793 died 1866. "When seventeen years old participated in the War of 1812" He married Sarah Heathman who was born 1803 and died 1882. One of their children was Enoch N. Cooksey who was born Dec. 6, 1841 and married Mary Dority who was born July 18, 1851. (Goodspeed's History of Tennessee, page 1020)

I remember Enoch N. Cooksey or Mr. Newt as he was called. He was a veteran of the Civil War. Mary Dority was the daughter of John and Emily (Tolar) Dority. Emily Dority is buried in the Trice-Leigh Cemetery. May 11, 1822- Jan 6, 1893. She married John Dority 1843. His footstone is there but the head stone is gone.

Enoch N. and Mary (Dority) had seven children: Virginia who married Jim Foster; Lilly who married Will Parker; Frances who died unmarried; Newt died unmarried; James Calvin died unmarried, Tim and Ernest married but died without issue. (from my Tolar records. AWD)

WILLIAM CRUTCHER - REVOLUTIONARY WAR

Research so far has not established his birth, death and marriage. It is assumed that he was born in Spotsylvania Co., Va. A soldier in the Revolutionary War. Came to Nashville in 1784 and purchased land on the same day as Anthony, his brother. He moved later to Montgomery Co., Tenn. He was scalped by the Indians and left with a knife sticking in his back on Blooming Grove Creek west of Clarksville. He recovered from this experience. (from PECK FAMILY, p. 57 by William Greer Peck, 5705 Rosario, Atascadero, Calif. 93422)

This was in 1786 (Along the Warioto by Ursula S. Beach)

ANTHONY CRUTCHER - REVOLUTIONARY WAR

No birth, death, etc. records. He was a Lt. with the North Carolina troops in the Revolutionary War and served to the end of the war. A land transfer in Spotsylvania Co., Va. links him to Surry Co., N. C. It is believed that he married a Binkley about 1795. He was appointed to Court, Pleas & Quarter Sessions by Gov. Wm. Blount of Tennessee Co. Anthony was a noted Indian fighter on the Red River. He was on the commission that laid out and established the town of Clarksville, Tenn. in 1785 (from THE PECK FAMILY, page 57)

John Trice is administrator of Paul Castleberry decd. - made 18 July 1815. Edward Trice and Thos. Bunch were bondsmen (Will Book B., p.279)

John Trice married Nancy Castleberry.
