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SOLDIERS FROM MONTGOMERY CO., TENNESSEE in the WAR OF 1812 and THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR by Anita Whitefield Darnell

JAMES BAGGETT - REVOLUTIONARY WAR

Records from Revolutionary War Pension File No. S-39159, from National Archives & Records Service, Washington, D. C. Have not located his grave in Montgomery Co. He may be buried at Baggett's Chapel Cemetery on Highway 13 - or he may be at Baggett's Cemetery on Budd's Creek, Palmyra - or Hackberry area. First Montgomery County records show him listed on the 1806 voting petition.

May 7, 1818 he is living in Montgomery County. His age 62; his mother lives with him and is "upwards of 100 years". His wife is "very infirm" and his sons "are grown and left him". In October, 1820, he renewed his pension application, stating he is a farmer by occupation, aged 64; his wife, Nancy, is 62. No other family. His property consists of 20 acres of land; one mare and colt; 4 head of cattle; 7 head of sheep; 5 head of common size hogs; 8 pigs; 1 large irom kettle; 2 iron pots; 1 dutch oven; 1 skillet; 1 chest; 1 table; 1 rawhide; and some shelf or cupboard articles; 2 dollars "due me" and "I am in debt thirty-five dollars".

Revolutionary War records states he enlisted in Anson County, North Carolina, near the South Carolina line, in the month of March preceding the fall of Ft. Moultrie. He marched to Charleston, S. C.; went to Sullivan Islands; took part in siege of Ft. Moultrie. Served in states of Georgia and South Carolina. In service 15 months.

Micajah Baggett, son of James, bought 54 acres of land on Budd's Creek Jan. 5, 1807 (Montgomery Co. Min. Book 1. p. 70) This was part of 360 acres owned by William Copeland. Witnesses to the deed were Abraham Baggett and James Baggett. Micajah Baggett married Alley Parker, Jan. 12, 1808 in Montgomery Co. They are the great-great grandparents of E. B. Baggett, Clarksville, Tenn. The above information was supplied by Eileen M. Baggett, 1494 Golf Club Lane, Clarksville, Tenn. 37040.

On 17th October 1820 James Baggett appears in open court and makes a statement of his property value and statement of his service in the Revolutionary War. (Minute Book 10. page 258 Montgomery Co., Tenn.)

WILLIAM HAIR - REVOLUTIONARY WAR

On this 17th day of October 1820 the schedule and declaration of William Hair was produced in open court (it being a court of record, having the power of fine and imprisonment for the county of Montgomery and State of Tennessee) and on motion was ordered to be entered at full length on the records of said court in the words following to wit:

Schedule of the property of William Hair to wit: one cow, one heifer, one sow, two iron pots, two iron spiders, two iron skillets, one small case, one chest, one table, some few shelf or cubbard articles, two smoothing irons, one water pail, one iron wedge, four glass bottles? one runlet, and one bread tray. signed William Hair (X his mark)

Be it known that this day personally appeared before me, Stephen Thomas, one of the acting Justices of the Peace and Judge of the Court of Quorum, it being a court of record which have the power of fine and imprisonment for the said county, William Hair aged eighty three years, a farmer by occupation, but by reason of old age and bodily infermity not now able to pursue it, and now in such indigent circumstances as to be unable to support myself without the assistance of my country- my wife, Peggy by name, aged seventy nine years, no other family. The said William Hair is a resident in said county of Montgomery, who being first duly sworn accorning to law doth on his oath further declare that he served in the Revolutionary War, (for perticulars see the declaration made before Parry W. Humphreys Esquire one of the Circuit Judges in the State of Tennessee which declaration it is supposed is now in the office of the Secretary of War dated in January 1819) and I do further swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of the Act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval services of the United States in the Revolutionary War passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me, nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed (necessary clothing and beding excepted) and the said William Hair further maketh oath that his place of residence from the Court of Montgomery County is about fourteen miles and that I am so infirm as not to be able of myself to travel to the said court. signed William Hair (X- his mark) Sworn to, declared, and subscribed before me, Stephen Thomas, one of the acting Justices of the Peace, and Judge of the Court of Quorum in the State of Tennessee and County of Montgomery this 17th day of October 1820. signed S. Thomas Justice of the Peace.

It is the opinion of the court that the total amount in value of the property exhibited in the aforesaid schedule of William Hair is thirty seven dollars. (Minute Book 10, page 257, Montgomery Co., Tenn.)

JESSE ROBERTSON - REVOLUTIONARY WAR

On the 17th day of $0^{\rm C}$ tober 1820 personally appeared in open court (it being a court of record for said county) Jesse Robertson aged sixty two

years, resident of said county, who being first duly sworn according law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows by enlisting into Capt Lytle in the 6th Regiment of North Carolina and was transfered to the first on the 8th day of January 1778 and was discharged the 24th day of October 1799 at West Point in the state of New York original declaration dated the 28th day of May 1818 and number of pention certificate 12375 and I do solemly swere that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and Naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War, passed on the 18th day of March 1818, that I have not, nor has any person for me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed viz: one cow and yearling, one sow and eight pegs, income nothing and indebted more than is due to me, and by occupation a cooper but unable to pursue it for Rheumatic pains and old age; family consists of myself and wife the latter of whom is 66 years of age and much offlicted with Rheumatic. signed Jesse Robertson.

It is the opinion of the court that the total amount in value of the property exhibited in the aforesaid schedule of Jesse Robertson is twenty three dollars. (Minute Book 10, page 259, Montgomery Co., Tenn)

MANOAH BOSTICK - WAR OF 1812

Manoah Bostick was born in Stokes County, North Carolina in 1780. He was a member of the Virginia Legislature, Cabell Co.; Major in the War of 1812. He married first Jane Scales daughter of Nathaniel (Rev.). When Nathaniel and family moved to what is now Huntington, W. Va., Manoah Bostick and his wife moved too. Then Manoah went to Tennessee. It is said that Jane died and is buried in Montgomery County, Tennessee. Later Manoah went to Green County, Ill. However, he married Frances Taliaferro Harvie when she was visiting across the line in Kentucky.

I have proven Manoah for the War of 1812. In fact I named the Chapter here for him as was my priviledge when I organized it. I have proven his father, Absolom, for the Revolution. Some of the descendants might like this information.

(from a letter from Mrs. V. E. McArthur, 22 W 11th, Hutchinson, Kas. 67501)

In the Manson Cemetery located across the road from Fort Campbell on Highway 41-A is buried:

Sarah Elizabeth Bostick, wife of J. W. Manson, born Feb. 11, 1816 and died Oct. 21, 1863.

James W. Manson born June 10, 1804--died March 17, 1886.

I have run across Manoah Bostick several times in the old records of Montgomery Co. Book F, page 7 in the Wills and Records - \$5000 for the benefit of Mahala Harris, Elizabeth Harris, and Harrison Harris - Oct. 19, 1829. Manoah Bostick was guardian to the children.

Manoah Bostick is on the 1820 census of Montgomery Co., Tenn.
