The data below is from Goodspeed's HISTORY OF TENNESSEE page 1359.

JOHN H. BALTHROP was captured at Fort Donelson and taken to Camp Douglas at Chicago; held until Sept 1862. He rejoined his regiment and was at Vicksburg, Port Hudson, and Jackson, Miss. He then went to Mobile where he remained until the Battle of Missionary Ridge. Then to Dalton, Ga. until 1864. He joined the army at New Hope and was in all campaigns back to Peach Tree Creek and wounded in his right thigh causing amputation of his right leg. Then in hospitals at Macon and Cuthbert, Ga. until close of the war. Returned home; taught school until 1873; began mercantile business in Grantville; then he returned to Cheatham Co. Your compiler, W. G. Peck, remembers him as very jovial and cheerful when he visited his sister, Mary Lettitia (Balthrop) Peck.

We find that WILLIAM BALTHROP (who married MARY CHRISTIAN in 1772 in N. C.) and 3 of his sons, (WILLIAM W. BALTHROP, WYLIE BALTHROP, AND FRANCIS BALTHROP) all migrated to Dickson Co., Tenn. prior to 1820. The 1820 and 1830 Federal Census of Dickson Co. show that all four of these were in this county with their families.

The children of FRANCIS BALTHROP are listed on page 51. His son, JOHN CHRISTIAN BALTHROP is among these.

SAMUEL SHEPHERD - REVOLUTIONARY WAR

(Contributed by Eleanor Shepherd Williams, (Mrs. James W.), Route 5,

from Montgomery County Circuit Court - August Term 1832

On the 28th day of August in the year of our lord one thousand and eight hundred and thirty two personally appeared in open court before the judge of the Circuit Court now sitting for Montgomery County, Samuel Shepherd, a resident of Montgomery County in the State of Tennessee, aged sixty nine years lacking one month, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as here in stated. At the time when he the said Samuel Shepherd entered the service he was a resident of the State of North Carolina and of the County of Orange and lived about 13 miles from Hillsboro. He was born on the 28th day of September in the year 1763 as appears from a family record made by his father and now in his (the said Samuel's) possession, which he believes to be correct and true. He entered the service in the year 1780 and in the month of June as a drafted soldier in the North Carolina line of militia - and at the time he was drafted he lived with Edward Trice who is now living and a resident of this county and will swear to many of the facts which I shall state in this declaration. He was drafted for a 3 months tour under Capt. Ray who was afterwards either broke or resigned, as was succeeded by his 1st Lieutenant Morton in the command of the company. He was ordered under a major who as well as he recollects was by the name of Nalls or Nawls, into South Carolina under the command of General Gates, and arrived at Rugeloy's Mills near Camden about a day before the defeat of Gates. When that disastrous battle took place he was not in the battle in consequences of his being detached to guard the baggage waggons. But as soon as the defeat took place a general retreat was ordered and the rest of this said disaster is but too faithfully recorded in history. After returning home and his term of service being expired, he was again drafted immediately to suppress and hold in check the Tories in North Carolina. His captains name was Mark Patterson and his General Malbady or some such a name. He was a Frenchman or of French descent. This was a horse company and the tour only of 2 months duration. Whilst out on this tour there was a battle at Lindleys Mill between the Whigs and Tories in which he (the said Samuel) had a brother killed --but he was not in it himself. He was in a skirmish which took place between the Whigs and Tories at Cockes Mills, a short time after the battle at Lindley's Mills, in which he took an active part and in the pursuit of the Tories, he was very near capturing the Tory Col. whose name was Fanning -- He pursued him more than a mile but the Col.'s horse proved the fleetest and he escaped. Cockes Mill stood on Deep River and Lindleys on Haws River. Then he served another tour as

a drafted soldier under Captain Benjamin Herndon, the object being the same, to hold the Tories who were very numerous, in check. The Major's name and Col.'s not recollected in this tour of 2 months. (Col. O'Neal was an officer whilst only upon the first 2 months tour operations which he did not recollect at the time of hearing about it.) There was no fighting that he now can recollect whilst under Capt. Herndon. The (rest of page cannot be read -- poor copy) (next page begins) note. The company was however continually on the alert reconnoitering the country and frustrating the schemes of the Tories. The country through which he marched was principally upon Haws and Deep Rivers -- He whilst under General Malbady arrived at Guilford Courthouse the evening after the battle between Cornwallis & Greene. This officer was his General in the two first named 2 months tours as well as he now recollects -- the other officers names, now remembered were Baron de Globnek and General Butler. He states that Malberdy did not join Greene at Guilford but that he might have been of immense service to him if he had done so. He has no documentary evidence to prove his service and no discharge. The facts stated are true but his recollection of the dates of service after the first tour of duty is very indistinct owing to the great lapse of time that has intervened and the belief that it would never be necessary. His only witness now living, that he knows of is Edward Trice who served with him one tour and knows of his having served all, for he was in the neighborhood and a part of the time his house was his home. He hereby relinquishes every claim to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the Pension Role of any state or Agency of any state. /s/ Samuel Shepherd. Sworn to and subscribed in open court this day and year afsd. P. N. Marr Clerk.

We Robt McCorkle Clergyman, residing in the County of Montgomery & State of Tennessee, and Edw Trice residing in the same are well acquainted with Samuel Shepherd who has subscribed and sworn to the above declaration: That we believe him to be 69 years of age lacking one month, that he is respected and believed in the neighborhood where he lives to have been a soldier of the Revolution and that we concur in that opinion. /s/ Robert McCorkle /s/ Edward Trice

And the said court do hereby declare their opinion after the investigation of the matter and after putting the interrogations prescribed by the War Department, that the above named applicant was a Revolutionary Soldier and served as he states. And the Court further certifies that it appears to them that Robt. McCorkle who signed the preceeding certificate is a clergyman resident in the County of Montgomery and State of Tennessee and that Edwd Trice who has also signed the same as a resident of the county and state afsd and is a credible person and that their statement is entitled to credit. It further appears on his examination that he was born in Virginia in Middlesex County, from thence moved to North Carolina and remained until he removed to Tennessee where he still resides in this county of Montgomery. Edward Trice witnesses that he knew Shepherd who lived with him and was drafted into the militia service, at the time of Gates defeat; he knew of his volunteering for service for two months in horse company. All which is witnessed. /s/ P. W. Humphreys

John Smith was born in Maryland in 1788 and died April 15, 1856. He married Peggy Rudolph in 1804 in North Carolina. Peggy died Dec. 5, 1862. There were ten children. One was Dr. Alexander Smith born Jan. 3, 1800 in North Carolina and married Paralee Rudolph. John Smith came to Tennessee in 1811. "He was a soldier in the Creek and Seminole War" (Goodspeed's HISTORY OF TENNESSEE, page 1101)
