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## CRUTCHER FAMILY

(by Wm Greer Peck, 5705 Roserio Ave., Atascadero, Calif. 93422.)

The CRUTCHERS were among the early settlers of Va. The non-uniformity of the spelling of the name CRUTCHER in the early Va. records has been a handicap to all researchers in establishing family lineages. We find that the name has been spelled CROUCHER, CRECHER, CRICHER, CRICHTER, CROWDER, CROUTHER, CROUCH, and CRICKER. Our earlier lawyers, ministers, and county clerks "spelled by ear" without concern for accuracy. But an even greater handicap found by researchers was the destruction of Virginia records that occurred with courthouse fires, the Revolutionary War, and Civil War with the latter being the worst offender since Virginia was on the Confederate side in the war.

The following pages are meant to suffice as an outline of family lineages of CRUTCHER. With the help of an index (as planned for the final manuscript), one will be able to pinpoint a person of their interest. It should be noted that this outline is not complete. Spaces are left for YOU to supply any vital data on individuals, family groups, and lineages. Please supply any documentary proof when available. Numerous items of documentary proof have been acquired for many listed in this brief outline. These will be used in a final manuscript. Any errors, omissions and additions to this embryo effort will be highly appreciated by W. G. Peck (whose mother was a CRUTCHER).

Please be on the lookout for any of our early ancestors who spelled the name as CROUCHER. My G-G-Gf was a LARKIN CRUTCHER of Robertson Co., Tenn. His name was listed as LARKIN CROUCHER in the records of Williamson Co., Tenn when he married his first wife, JULIA PRATT. He is believed to have been the first CRUTCHER settling in Williamson Co, having his marriage to JULIA PRATT some 12 years prior to the arrival of a WILLIAM CRUTCHER, Sr. from Amherst Co., Va. along with his children who were all born in Amherst Co., Va. Some of the children of WILLIAM CRUTCHER listed their names as CROUCHER in the marriage records. This WILLIAM CRUTCHER was originally in Caroline Co., Va. prior to his residence in Amherst Co., Va. where he married ELIZABETH POLLARD on 1/16/1784. But WHO WERE THE PARENTS OF LARKIN CRUTCHER (OR CROUCHER)??

Crutchers of the same first name are listed as Sr., Jr., III, etc. (when no middle name or initials are found) when in direct lineage. This is done to identify the individual as well as save space in copy. We are deeply in gratitude for the following CRUTCHER researchers for their gracious efforts in supplying data and documentary proofs in an attempt to write a book on CRUTCHER. The spelling of Crutcher is that as found in the records.

(no will) and that his son, HENRY CRUTCHER, Sr. came into court with estate certificate for settling his father's estate. An inventory was presented to the court on 8/22/1722 and signed by HENRY CRUTCHER, Sr. (See Essex Co., Va. Wills and Inventories, #3, 1717-1722.)

It is believed that there were other children, but there is no record of such. Numerous documentary records that prove the above 3 children as of THOMAS CRUTCHER, Sr have been found by Dr. Leonard DeLong Wallace and his wife, MAMIE C. WALLACE, a descendant of HENRY CRUTCHER, Sr. These data have been assembled and typed by Mrs. Margaret Miller of Mandeville, La. These typed records were graciously supplied to major libraries in which CRUTCHER descendants were found. These were copied by WGP in Frankfort, Ky.

THOMAS CRUTCHER III served in Rev. War as Capt of Spotsylvania Co. militia. We find that Thomas Crutcher III (see Nelson Co., Ky. Deed Bk #6, pg 58) gave his son, JAMES CRUTCHER, power of attorney to settle the estate of his father, Thomas Crutcher, Jr. of Caroline Co. -- stating that by reason of his age and infirmities he was unable to travel to Va. for this purpose.

C., Vol 4, pg 780, Chap. LXV on NC Laws: "An act to establish a town in the forks of Cumberland and Red River in Davidson Co. (now Montgomery) called Clarksville. And it is further enacted by auth. aforesaid that fr and after passing of this act, John Montgomery, Anthony Bledsoe, ANTHONY CRUTCHER, Wm Polk, and Lardner Clark, Esqs be ...hereby constituted commissioners for further designing, building, and improving said town, and they shall stand seized of an indefessible estate in fee simple, etc. 12/29/1783. He was a highly respected citizen of Clarksville, Tenn. Numerous land transfers and other records attest to his civic worth.

THOMAS CRUTCHER IV son of Thomas Crutcher III and Martha (Foster) Crutcher b. 2/18/1760 in Spotsylvania Co., Va. d 3/8/1844 in Nashville, Tenn. Buried in Nashville City Cemetery as a noted person. Buried inside an iron fence enclosed plot along with other CRUTCHERS: ---

THOMAS CRUTCHER, IV was never married. The following plaque is on his tombstone:--"For 25 years Treasurer of State of Tenn. He was born in Va. on Feb. 18, 1760 and

died at Nashville where he resided for 60 years, March 8, 1844, age 84. Of a stern but virtuous character, inflexible nature and full of purest benevolence. He enjoyed all his lengthened days, the veneration and confidence of the community and went down to the grave crowned with honors as he was covered with years." THOMAS CRUTCHER IV was mayor of Nashville in 1819. He was the father of and patron of the Female College of Nashville. There are numerous land records of his in counties of Middle Tenn. He came to Nashville circa 1784 which was about the same time as his brothers, ANTHONY and WILLIAM arrived.

William Crutcher Sr. was born in Caroline Co., Va. Records show that he came to Nashville, Tenn in 1784 and later to Montgomery Co., Tenn. with his brother, Anthony. A Montgomery Co., Tenn. item is found in Ramsey's Annals of Tennessee: "In 1785 on the waters of Blooming Grove Creek in this county, 3 men had a fight with Indians. The men, Peter Burnst, David Steele, and WILLIAM CRUTCHER, were out hunting and came upon a roving band of 20 Indians. A desperate fight ensued, Burnst and Steele were killed and CRUTCHER was shot and feigned death. The Indians scalped him and stuck his knife in him. He crawled to the creek for water, was found and recovered."

He was a Justice of the Peace.

HENRY CRUTCHER son of Thomas Crutcher III and Martha (Foster) Crutcher b 11/16/1776 in Caroline Co., Va. d 2/11/1857 in Nelson Co. Ky. He was given power of attorney to ask for JOHN CRUTCHER and JAMES CRUTCHER of Barren Co., Ky. relative to settling the estate of THOMAS CRUTCHER IV who died in Nashville of 3/8/1844. (see Davidson Co., Tenn. Bk 6, page 726.) James Crutcher appointed his son, Thomas S. Crutcher, to act in his stead on his brother's (Thomas Crutcher, IV) estate settlement. See Davidson Co. Bk 7, of 10/15/1844. Thomas Crutcher IV owned land in Dyer Co., Tenn, signed by John Crutcher, James Crutcher, and Sarah (Crutcher) Helm of Ky. --and by Thomas S. Crutcher, Edmund Crutcher, and Henry Crutcher of Tenn. Henry Crutcher served in the Ky. Legislature in 1814. ## CAPT MOSES SHELBY - REVOLUTIONARY WAR - WAR 1812

(Contributed by Charles E. Shelby, 431 Tatato Trail, Frankfort, Ky.)  
Capt. Moses Shelby (1760-1828) was born 31 October 1760 on the Maiden's Choice Plantation near North Mountain in Frederick (now Washington) Co. Maryland near the present site of Hagerstown. He was the last child of Evan Shelby Jr. (1719-94, Brigadier General of Militia, Washington District of North Carolina, and Letitia Cox (d. 1777) and a brother to Kentucky's first Governor, Isaac Shelby (1750-1826), and to Col. Evan Shelby III (1757-93) killed by indians in the Mero District of Middle Tennessee.

Evan Jr. moved his family in 1771 from Maryland to the Sapling Grove Plantation located on the present site of Bristol, Tennessee (formerly called King's Meadows). Evan Jr's grave may be found high atop the hill in the Military Section of the Bristol, Va. Cemetery.

Capt. Moses military service during the Revolutionary War included three major engagements, i.e., The Battle of King's Mountain, S. C. (Oct 7, 1780), The Battle of Cowpens (Jan. 17, 1781) and the Siege of Augusta (Georgia), May-June 1781.

His brother, Col. Isaac, commanded a regiment of Sullivan County Virginia Militia at King's Mountain, in which Moses was a Captain and his brother Evan was a Major. Moses received a fractured thigh in the battle and could be moved only a short distance from the battlegrounds. Here he lay on his back for three months. He was barely able to ride when he joined General Morgan a day or two before the Battle of Cowpens (Jan. 17, 1781). Here he was more severely wounded than at King's Mountain, and lay until March or April in the hands of a surgeon. When Colonel Clarke of Georgia and his troops stopped en route to begin the Siege of Augusta, Moses joined the expedition despite his sore and open wounds. Moses was appointed Captain of Horse. On one occasion, he received six sabre wounds.

In 1782 he joined a group of adventurers heading for the new settlements located near the present site of Nashville, Tennessee. He served with his brother Evan III as a guard in the party of his brother Isaac - one of the Commissioners, laying off the N. C. Military Land Grants for Revolutionary Service. For this he received a 1000 acre land grant on Stewart's Creek of Stones River in now Rutherford Co., Tenn. He later moved up to Montgomery County in the vicinity of Renfro's Station at the junction of the Cumberland and Red River in Montgomery Co., near the present site of Clarksville, Tenn. Here he married Milly Renfro, a daughter of one of the Renfros about 1784-85.

Subsequently, he moved across the state line into Logan County Kentucky 1792-94, finally settling in Christian County on Claylick Creek, 1794-96, about 20 miles from the junction of the Cumberland with the Ohio River. Livingston County was formed from Christian in 1798. Moses was a Justice of the Peace and a Colonel Commandant, 24th Regiment Christian (Livingston) Co. Militia 1796. Moses remained in Livingston County until the fall of 1812 when he moved to the New Madrid District

of Missouri and located on land two miles south of the town. He died Sept. 17, 1828.

Gov. Isaac aged 62, led 4000 Kentucky Volunteers during the War of 1812 to join Gen. Harrison in the invasion of Canada, helping defeat the British at the Battle of Thames, Oct. 5, 1813. The younger Capt. Moses earlier led a group of troops on a single skirmish up the Wabash River in Indiana Territory in 1812. This is attested to by a Power of Attorney filed in the National Archives, of Moses Shelby, County of New Madrid, Territory of Missouri, dated 19 October 1816 empowering a Livingston County Attorney, Joseph R. Givens, to collect the allowance due for his service as Captain under Brigadier General Samuel Hopkins in Caldwell's 1 st. Regiment Kentucky Mounted Militia.

Children of Moses and Milly Renfro are thought to include: Evan, Josiah, James, Isaac (1795-1877) m 1821 Catherine Hart Proctor (1804-44) Smith, Columbus, and Catherine m 1811 Washington Stewart.

Ordered that Joel Benham be appointed overseer of the road from where Corbins road intersects the Furnace to the Dickson County line in place of Ed- Wats.

PARRY WAYNE HUMPHREYS (c. 1777 - 1839)

from BIOGRAPHICAL DIRECTORY-TENNESSEE GENERAL ASSEMBLY 1796-1969,  
(Preliminary, No. 17), Montgomery County. Tenn. State Library and  
Archives, Nashville, Tenn.

SENATE, 7th General Assembly, 1807; representing counties of Montgomery, Dickson, Robertson, and Stewart; served from convening of Assembly Sept 21, 1807 to Dec. 3, 1807, on which date he resigned; on same day was elected by joint convention of both houses of legislature to newly created state Superior Court of Law and Equity; Assembly adjourned following day. Born at Stanton, Va., in 1777 or 1778; son of Joshua and Anne Katherine (Jones) Humphreys. "Pursued preparatory studies"; studied law and admitted to bar, 1801. Married Jan. 31, 1805, to Mary West, daughter of George and Elizabeth (Clark) West; she was probably a native of Bertie County, N. C.; children--West Hughes, Charles Jones, Elizabeth, Joshua P., Georgianna, and Robert West. Grew to manhood in Lexington, Ky.; moved to Clarksville, Montgomery Co., at undetermined date before 1806; named trustee of Rural Academy, Clarksville 1806. Elected to Superior Court of Law and Equity, Dec. 3, 1807; in 1809 the legislature abolished the Superior Court of Law and Equity and, in Nov. 16, the same year, created a Superior Court of Errors and Appeals along with five judicial circuits; at that time the legislature elected Humphreys judge of 5th Judicial Circuit; he served from Nov. 21, 1809, to 1813; elected as a Democrat to U. S. House of Representatives, 13th Congress, and served from Mar. 4, 1813 to Mar. 3, 1815; unsuccessful candidate for U. S. Senate on Whig ticket, 1817; again elected judge of 5th Judicial Circuit, serving from 1818 to 1836; unsuccessful candidate for Governor, 1835. Humphreys County created in 1809 is named in his honor. At end of judicial term, 1836, moved to Hernando, Miss., to engage in banking business until his death; sources differ as to whether death occurred Jan. 9, Jan. 19, or March 1, 1834; buried in Methodist Cemetery, Hernando. Father of West Hughes Humphreys, sometime member Tennessee General Assembly.

According to the foreword, Dinwiddie County, Virginia, was formed in 1752 from Prince George County, Virginia. All of the early Court-house records were lost during the Civil War. However, the Grants, Patents and Land Tax Records, copies of which were kept by the Commonwealth of Virginia, are preserved in the Virginia State Library. The Grant and Patents were copied at the Virginia State Library and a very extensive study was made of Films J. R. 3390 and J. R. 3396, for this volume.

The land records are presented in alphabetical order so that all can be studied for one family in a very simple, quick way.
