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THE WELLS FAMILY

This is about the search for information on two Montgomery County men named Martin Wells, Junr. and Martin Wells, Senr.¹ It is a quest that stretches through the years of their lives and the many counties and states where they lived. Parts of the story are documented; parts are circumstantial; much is still unknown.

The name Martin Wells is found in North Carolina. In 1759 a man named Martin John Wells was on the Rowan County tax list. Sixteen years later in New Hanover County a man named Martin Wells was one of the persons authorized to seek and collect arms for the use of district companies that were mobilizing against the king's forces.²

That same year he was licensed to keep an ordinary. From then until 1796 his name appears with fair regularity in court records of New Hanover County.³ Martin Wells of New Hanover received from North Carolina three grants totalling 650 acres. The first warrant was issued in 1779.⁴ He was already a man with a family, but where he lived in the preceding years is unknown.

In the 1790 census all Wells names in Wilmington District are spelled Wills in the printed Heads of Families. In New Hanover County were:

Wills, Marten: 1 male over 16, 2 under 16, 3 females, 10 slaves

Wills, Robert: 2 males over 16, 2 under 16, 1 female, 3 slaves

Toward the end of the eighteenth century many families moved from southeast North Carolina to the area of Montgomery County, Tennessee. Among the names that appear in both places are Gause Brinson, David Wells, Morgan Brown, Benjamin Adams, Thomas Simmons, John Duff, Duncan Stewart, Lewis Brock, Hardy Valentine, James Fentress, Jonathan Tompkins, Etherington Rochell, Starling May, Elisha Ellis, and Martin

Wells. William Blake moved to Tennessee later. By 1800 there were no Wells (or Wills) in New Hanover. Robert Wells, who also owned property in Bladen County, died in 1792.⁵ Martin Wells and his wife, Nancy, sold their New Hanover land in 1796.⁶ Two years later Martin's name was on the previously mentioned Montgomery County tax list. He died in 1803. His sureties (Morgan Brown, David Wells, Martin Wells, Duncan Stewart, Gause Brinson and Hayden Wells), were bound in the sum of six thousand dollars. In spite of having this estate, no property in his name has yet been found. The 1798 tax list showed only three Negro polls by his name. In 1804 Nancy Wells, his widow, deeded her share of the estate--slave Sarah and her child Peggy--to her sons Henry and Morgan.⁸ The sons were mere babies. In 1815 they were still minors when Thomas Simmons was appointed their guardian with James Fentress security.⁹ Papers dealing with the partition of the estate are missing. Later, census records confirm that Morgan was born in 1801.¹⁰ Henry was close in age. Besides the two babies, the names of Martin Wells' other children are only guessed. James Fentress, whose wife was Barbara Wells, was probably a son-in-law.¹¹

Another daughter married William Blake.¹² Martin Wells, Junr. and David Wells were probably sons. David Wells had witnessed the 1796 sale of land in New Hanover. Any Wells of Montgomery, Dickson, Stewart and Houston Counties is a possible child or relative. John J. Wells was probably kin. Difficulties arise because in this same part of Tennessee lived the large Hayden Wells Family. Hayden came from Virginia to Tennessee by way of Kentucky and Illinois, and was a founder of Nashville. He was a large landowner, but the names of his children are not known. The result is an area where two large Wells families left records which are all mixed together. Martin Wells, Senr., and Martin Wells, Junr., each named a son Morgan.

Their friend (relative?) Dr. Morgan Brown of North Carolina, had been a physician, a revolutionary officer, a South Carolina legislator, laid out Palmyra, had an iron works on Yellow Creek, and kept a store. His account book lists the names of dozens of Montgomery County settlers. His son, Will, jotted some casual remarks about Wellses in a diary he kept for a few months.¹³ Apparently, the two families lived a neighborly distance apart.

Martin Wells, Junr., the second man of this quest, was born December 9, 1774, according to a bible which is now missing. With the exception of the 1798 tax listing and his mention in the estate of Martin Wells, Senr., he does not appear in the records until 1806 when he bought land in Stewart County. From 1806 until 1814, he was buying and selling land, generally on Guices Creek. In 1808, George Boyd deeded him ¹⁴154 acres on Barrett's Creek which Martin sold in 1811 to John Wofford. On February 10, 1807, Martin married Sarah (Sally) Boyd. Their children: Mary 1808, Jane 1809, Margaret 1812, Wayman Frederick 1815, George 1817, Martin Jones 1819 Ala., Sarah 1822,¹⁵ David Andrew 1824, Henry Bolivar 1826 Ala., John Morgan 1829 Ala.¹⁵ From 28 January till 10 May 1814, Martin Wells served in Captain James Haggard's company of mounted riflemen, marching two hundred eighty miles to the places where they were in service and returning to their residence in Stewart County.¹⁶ In 1815, he sold his last two tracts of Stewart County land to Absalom Fentress (his nephew?).¹⁷ Between 1814 and 1816 it is possible that Martin Wells went to Missouri where he is supposed to have lived near Troy, in the part of St. Charles County that became Lincoln County in 1818.¹⁸ It would not have been a logical move to journey one year as far north as the next year he journeyed south, but our ancestors did not always act logically! When the 1816 census of Alabama was taken, Martin Wells was in Wash-

ington County. He had been a landowner there since 1811 when he and David Williams together bought 57 acres. In 1818, Martin Wells patented the land he and Williams had bought. In 1825, he bought four tracts in Marengo County, and in 1829 he sold out and went to Bastrop County, Texas.¹⁹ So, the search extends from New Hanover County, N. C., to Bastrop, Texas; from 1774 to 1836. Only in Montgomery County do the records show the lives of these two men overlapping, and it is there that I hope their relationship can be established and the names of other kinfolk discovered.

ADDITIONS TO RIVERVIEW CEMETERY
CLARKSVILLE, TENNESSEE

"For some years Albert L. Jones was in the tobacco trade business in Clarksville, as well as being a land owner and merchant at Garrettsburg, Christian Co., Kentucky. He married Miss Hardin T. Wills, dau. of George Wills, a prominent planter of those days at Garrettsburg. They had no children. Perrins History of Christian Co., Ky. tells of the time in October 1867 when Albert L. Jones and Dr. J. C. Metcalfe of Garrettsburg shot each other in the road in front of the Jones Store at Garrettsburg. Dr. Metcalfe wasn't wounded badly and recovered, but Mr. Jones died on the spot. Some say that Mrs. Jones spent quite a sum to build that vault at Riverview in which she buried her husband. In August 1869, she married Thomas J. Munford, Sr. of Clarksville and he died the next spring. Some years later she moved to New Providence and died there in 1889. She was buried in the Vault by her first husband, and Mr. Munford was buried by his wife, Ann, in the same cemetery in 1871. By the way, Ann Munford was a daughter of Whitfield Killebrew of Montgomery County, and married first George Whitfield and then Thomas J. Munford. I know they had a son, Thomas J. Munford, Jr., for he was long a resident of Clarksville and prominent in the city government at the time." John Wm. Johnson, 3528 Mimbro Lane, Chattanooga, Tennessee

EDWARD TRICE - REVOLUTIONARY WAR

Edward Trice was born about 1745. Probably in Orange County, N. C., by 1773. Proof by 1777. Bought land in Montgomery County, Tenn. in 1807 and died in Montgomery Co. in 1832. He married (1) Tabithia Shepherd? about 1773 in Orange Co., N. C. Tabitha was born 1748, Middlesex Co., Va., dau of Henry and Tabithia Shepherd.

Children were:

1. Henry Trice born about 1774. Died Orange Co., N. C. 1840 m. dau of John and Susannah Daniel. Seven children. (Will)
2. Shepherd Trice born about 1776. Died Montgomery Co., Tenn. m. in Orange Co., N. C. 25 Sept. 1806 to Elizabeth House dau of Peter and Nancy (Trice) House. Three children. (Will)
3. Frances Trice born 1778 N. C. (census date). Died 1853 Montgomery Co., Tenn. m. in Orange Co., N. C., April 1, 1803 to James Shepher. Eight children. (Will)
4. Mary (Polly) Trice born June 5, 1780 N. C. Died July 15, 1857 in Montgomery Co., Tenn. (Bible record - tombstone) Married George Washington Leigh 30 December 1801 Orange Co., N. C. Seven children
5. Robert Trice born about 1782 N. C. In 1830 he was in Montgomery Co., Tenn. with a wife and 2 sons. In 1833 he was in Marikin Co. Kentucky.

Edward Trice married (2) Nancy Mechum 28 July 1785 in Orange Co., N.C.

1. Lewis Trice born N. C. Died Montgomery County, Tenn. Married Lorannah McCarroll. Four or five children.
2. James Trice born N. C. Died Montgomery Co., Tenn. (Dec. 30, 1787- July 1, 1853) Married Zelpha Mallory. Four known children. (Tombstone and Will)
3. Nancy Trice died 1844 Montgomery Co., Tenn. (unmarried)
4. Tabithia Trice born N. C. 1795 (census date). Married Edward Dycus. Five Children on 1850 census.
5. Thomas Trice Jan. 10, 1798 - Sept. 6, 1846. Married Jane Trice. Three children (Bible Record)
6. Jane Trice born (1800-1810) Died Montgomery Co., Tenn 1846/49. Married May Trice. Six children. (Will)
7. Anderson Trice Aug. 20, 1801 - Aug. 22, 1843 Montgomery Co., Tenn. Married Harriett McCorkle. Nine children. (Court records and tombstone)

8. Cathrine Trice married Robert Sawyer. Five Children. (Court records. Will of Nancy Trice)
9. Elizabeth Trice died before August 1846 in Montgomery Co., Tenn. Married William Holloway. Four children. (Will of William Holloway)

I had no idea that my Edward Trice has served a tour in the Revolutionary War until Eleanor Shepherd Williams obtained the pension record of Samuel Shepherd. (See Vol. II, #3, page 55--"His only witness now living, that he knows of is Edward Trice who served with him one tour") Now, it seems, that Samuel and Edward may have married Meacham (Mechum, Meckum, Mitchem) sisters. All genealogy fascinates me but the unexpected windfall warms the cockles of my heart! AWD

CAVE JOHNSON - War of 1812

Cave Johnson was born 11 Jan. 1793, three miles east of Springfield, Robertson Co., Tenn. and died 23 Nov. 1866 at Clarksville, Tenn. He married Mrs. Elizabeth Brunson, daughter of Isaac and Martha (Norfleet) Dortch. They had three sons:

1. James Hickman Johnson b. at Clarksville 8 Oct. 1840. Was lieutenant of Co. G. under Capt. William A. Forbes in the Confederate Army. Later made Capt. and then Major. He m. Mary Boyd 1867.
 - a. Cave Johnson b. 24 July 1868 -Aug. 1869.
 - b. Boyd Johnson b. 12 May 1870 - lawyer. Unmarried.
2. Thomas Dixon Johnson M.D. - surgeon in Egyptian army as Major. Later practiced in Clarksville.
3. Polk Grundy Johnson, officer in Confederate Army, lawyer, Clerk & Master of Montgomery Co., Tenn. He died in New York City while prosecuting a lawsuit July 28, 1888.

Cave Johnson (1793-1866) "joined his father Brig. Gen. Thomas Johnson as deputy brigade quarter-master in a command that was prominent in the War of 1812"

Lawyer - 1817; Attorney general of Tennessee, 1828-1835; Congress 1839-1845. President Polk made him postmaster general of the United States. 1854 president of the Bank of Tennessee.
