Copied from microfilm. Original list is in the State Library and Archives in Nashville, Tenn. Besides the information listed below, the original list includes the tax on the listed items. The tax rate was \$1.00 per \$1,000 or 1/10 of 1%. Tax per white poll was 25¢. SL and CR by certain entries denote School Land and Carriages. Space did not permit listing them in a separate column as on the original.

James Jr. was probably born about 1746. On July 4, 1767, his father, James Paine, Sr. of Orange County, North Carolina, deeded to his son, James Paine, Jr. of Bute (then) County, North Carolina, (later Warren County) almost 2000 acres of land, stock, slaves, etc. as recorded in Bute County D. B. 2/p.35. I think this must have been at one time, the "Home Place" of Dr. James Paine who was settling further west in what later was to become Person County.

James Jr. was certainly of age in 1775 when appointed to help divide the estate of John Malone which would prove he was born no later than 1754.

James Sr. was presiding Justice of Bute County the year it was formed, 1764, as James Jr. would have been too young.

James Jr. had married Esther ? by 24 December 1777, as his wife signed deed for land sold to Thomas Hall.

He had at least one son, John, mentioned in the will of Dr. James Paine, Sr. dated 4 March 1782. He held many offices; justice for many years, sheriff, treasurer, member of House of Commons in North Carolina Legislature 1784. Senator 1796, Trustee of Warrenton Male Academy in 1790's. He is listed in records as Capt., Major, and Colonel. Death reported in North Carolina newspaper as Colonel James Paine died Feb. 18, 1808.

His will is recorded WB 14, p. 273, Warren County, North Carolina. Will dated Nov. 1807. Heirs listed:

Wife: Esther (Have not found her maiden name but she died early 1823 when estate could be settled).

Sons: James (b. before 1790, m. 12 Oct. 1809 Polly Alexander)  
Thomas (b. 28 Feb. 1791 m. 10 Feb. 1813 Cynthia F. Power [Jan. 9, 1793 - Apr. 10, 1860])

Daughters: Rebecca, wife of Hasten (Hastin) Poe and Grand-daughter Elizabeth Paine Poe.

Sarah, wife of (Joseph) Hardaway

Polly, wife of        Nicholson (probably George)

Esther (m. 5 Jan., 1809 to Lott Hazard)

Lucy

(A son John, listed in will of James, Sr. must have died as he is not mentioned.)

The son James (III) m. Mary Worsham Alexander and moved to Robertson County, Tenn. where he wrote his will dated 8 June 1817. The will was ordered to be recorded in Montgomery County by the Robertson County Court Feb., 1818. It was not recorded until Oct., 1822, by which time the widow had married Gerald Van Buren. Minor heirs were Robert A., Mildred N., and Sally W. Paine. Robert A. died 1823. Last record of this family in Montgomery County was in Court Order Book 14 p. 235, 1829, when Van Buren had posted bond as guardian of Mildred N. and Sally W. Paine in Murray (Maury?) County.

A William L. Paine shows up in 1830 census of Giles County, Tenn. Possibly brother of James and Thomas. No other information.

Esther Paine, widow of James, Jr., died 1823 and about the same time, Thomas Paine's father-in-law, John Power died and his estate was also divided. This must have presented the opportunity for Thomas to move "West".

Thomas and Cynthia already had a nice family started. The ones I can verify are as follows:

Thomas purchased land in Montgomery County 2 June 1828 near his brother-in-law, Samuel D. Power. This land must have been near Thomasville in what is now Cheatham Co. He appears in 1830 Census of Montgomery and 1840 Census of Robertson County. His sister-in-law, Mrs. Gerald Van Buren was still living in Montgomery County when he arrived in Tenn.

Thomas Paine was evidently a carpenter and builder. (From list of items at his estate sale, and court record of his building a bridge over Spring Creek, on what is now Hwy. 79 near Kentucky state line.) He was well educated (from records of his transactions) and educated his children as well as possible at that time and place. He evidently died unexpectedly 9 April 1846 as he left no will and he had been very careful to record other transactions. His widow was appointed exect. and the bond signed by the three sons who were of age, John, James and Thomas. Court set aside provisions for the widow and three minor children. The three eldest sons were masons.

Thomas appears to have been no huge success as a businessman as there were times where he had to borrow against his slaves and sold them from time to time. He left a small estate. Upon Thomas' death the family split up. Henrietta had married in 1840 and the mother was living with her in Robertson County, Tenn. (1850 census). John L. and James E. were married and living in Montgomery Co., Tenn. (1850 census) Robert W. had settled in Cadiz, Kentucky, and Thomas P. was in Eddyville, Kentucky (1850 Census). M. C. was in Ballard Co., Kentucky; Emily in Trigg Co., Ky.

Information Thomas' children, not in order of birth is as follows:

EMILY E. G. PAINE b. 26 Sept. 1815, d. after 1850 census. m. 20 Aug. 1833 Henry Cahoon (Calhoun?) b. ca 1809, living 1880 census.

This is the same Little Emily Paine that stuck the hot poker in the churn to burn the Bell Witch. See M. V. Ingram's AUTHENTICATED HISTORY OF THE BELL WITCH p. 250.

ROBERT W. PAINE b. 1825 in North Carolina m. in Trigg County, Kentucky 9 May 1850, Emily Thompson. He appeared in Poll Books of Trigg County until 1853. Next information is from a letter written from Morton, Miss. to his brother, Thomas, at Eddyville dated 13 Jan., 1861. (This is a real gem!) Robert's wife must have died as she does not appear in 1860 census along with Robert. He joined the Confederacy and on Saturday, Feb. 15, 1862, Lt. Robert W. Paine, of McCausland's Brigade, Twentieth Miss., was killed in action at Ft. Donaldson. Special mention of service was given Lt. Paine by Maj. W. N. Brown.

In persueance to an Act of Assembly passed in the year 1803 It is ordered by the Court that a Tax of Twenty Five Cents be laid on each Town Lott in the Town of Clarksville and the sheriff of This county is hereby authorized to collect and account for the same with James M. Reynolds who is hereby appointed to review the monies assesing from said tax and appropriate the same to repairing the streets of Clarksville.....

Ordered that the clerk make out a certificate of the lots in the Town of Clarksville on which the tax laid by the Court for repairing the streets have not been paid for the years 1804 and 1805 agreeable to a report thereof made at last September term 1806 by Henry Small Esquire collector of said tax for the same years and cause the same to be published in the public prints at Knoxville as well as in the Impartial review at Nashville that the same will be sold for the Tax and Costs due....

21 Deed of Conveyance - Joseph Patten and James Patten to James Huling was acknowledged in open court for 357 acres land.

Court adjourned until court in Course -(Signed) Willie Blount, Hugh McClure and Sam'l Gattis.

State of Tennessee Montgomery County... At a called Court began and held for the County of Montgomery at the Court House in the Town of Clarksville on Monday the 30th day of March 1807 for the trial of a Negro man slave Mosses charged with having committed the act of wilfull and malicious murder on the body of (torn) Minott.

Present the worshipfull Robert (torn), Thomas Smith, Hugh McClure John B. (torn), Samuel Gattis and James Stewart Esquires. Hugh F. Bell, Moses Oldham Senr., James Hambleton, and John Marshall four freeholders holding slaves in said County and duly summond to try the aforesaid slave Moses agreeable to the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided.

The said slave Moses was led to the bar in custody of the sheriff of Montgomery County and anamed and charged as aforesaid with having committed wilfull and malicious murder on the body of Samuel Minott and thereupon pleaded Not Guilty--and the aforesaid court consisting of the Worshipfull justices and the Freeholders aforesaid being sworn well and truly to try and true deleverance to make upon the issue joined between the people of the State and the aforesaid prisioner at the bar and having heard the evidence upon their oaths do say that they find the Negro man slave Moses Guilty of wilfull murder upon the body of the said Samuel Minott in manner and form as is charged against him.

Therefore it is considered by the said court that the said Moses be taken back to whence he came and thence to be conveyed to the place of Execution and to be hung by the neck until he is dead, dead, dead, and then to have his head cut off and the head to be put upon a pole and the Sheriff of Montgomery County is directed to put this judgment in execution this day between the Hours of two and three oclock. (signed)

This volume contains 1843 Tax List, Ballard Co., Ky (which give among other information the number of white males over 21 and the number of children 5-16); List of persons drawing US Pensions in 1882 in Calloway Co. (includes many War of 1812 widows); Lebanon Church of Christ Cemetery (Graves Co.); Fulton Co. Kentucky Confederate Pension Applications (which give date and place of birth of applicant); Fulton Co. Marriage bonds Bk. 1, May 1845 - 1856; McCracken Co., Ky. Marriages from the Vital Statistics 1852 - 1859 (gives age and place of birth for bride and groom); plus Bible Records, biographies, newspaper abstracts, and much more.

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LIVINGSTON CO., KENTUCKY TAX LIST 1800-1801-1802. 37 pages, Soft bound. Indexed. \$3.00. Compiled by Don Simmons, 1397 Johnson Blvd., Murray, Kentucky 42071.

These tax lists are as important to the researcher as a census. All three years list males 16-20 and males over 21, as well as acres of land and location of land. These list often pinpoint the year a person came to or left the area..or the year he died.

Mr. Simmons has also transcribed the 1799 tax list of this county, (See Christian County Kentucky Tax List for 1799, District 2) and the 1810 Census of Livingston Co.

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MECKLENBURG CO., VA. CENSUS 1840. Soft bound. Indexed \$3.50. Compiled by Don Simmons, 1397 Johnson Blvd. Murray, Kentucky 42071.

Mecklenburg Co. was formed in 1764 from Lunenburg Co. and is joined on the south by North Carolina. Many settlers came from this area to Middle Tennessee and westward.

This volume is the second in a projected series of three volumes. It contains 5500 enteries.

Each cemetery is numbered and a corresponding number placed on the enclosed map designating its location. Thus cemetery #1-22 would be found in District #1, Cemetery #22. In addition to this very helpful map, directions for locating the cemeteries are given in the text of the book.

Although this is reduced print, it is very clear and the surnames are typed first and in capital letters making it very easy to locate a disired name.

Included in this volume is part of Elmwood Cemetery, the large City Cemetery in Springfield. Although this cemetery was not established until 1888 the death dates go back as early as 1843. A number of bodies were reinterred from family burying grounds and in 1953 when Cheatham Park School was built on the site of Cheatham Cemetery (an earlier city Cemetery) 115 bodies were moved to Elmwood.
