TOWNSEND RECORDS

From the files of the Whitley Collection of Genealogical Material--
Mrs. Edythe Rucker Whitley, Genealogist-Historian, 1604 South Observa-
tory Drive, Nashville, Tenn. 37215.

This Townsend Family Record is partly from records obtained from Dr.
Thomas Jefferson Townsend and presumably from an old Bible. There is
no date shown on the Bible.

The Townsends were in Accomac and Isle of Wight Counties, Virginia,
in the early part of the 1700's. Some of the descendants of this
branch of the family which we give herein, claim that they came from
Scotland about 1750, which this genealogist feels is somewhat doubt-
ful, due to the considerable number of families of the name in Virginia
during the Revolutionary period.

Thomas Townsend Sr. was born November 1732; became a citizen of Pitt-
sylvania County, Virginia 1752 at which place he married Anaphilda
Watson; removed to Greenville, S. C. in 1774.

After the death of Thomas Townsend, May 10, 1796, Anaphilda moved to
Logan County, Kentucky and was buried at Red River Church yard.

Logan County, Kentucky Deeds A-1 page 496. Jan. 22, 1802. Wm Burks sold to Peyton Nowlen 120 acres land on South side of North Fork of Red River corner to Light Townsend; speaks of Burk's Spring Branch; Also dividing line between William and George Burks, near Ralph Fleming's plantation; witness by Levi Burks, Light Townsend, Jabus Townsend.

Same reference, page 566. Nov. 3, 1796, John Bailey sold to Light Townsend for 100 pounds land on South side of Fork of Red River, 100 acres corner to Peyton Nowlin on Northeast. Wm. Burks line, speaks of Burk's spring.

Deed Book A-1, page 581. April 11, 1803. Henry Smith sold to Thomas Townsend for 81 pounds land in South fork of Red River opposite Wm. Harrison's mills of said Fork 91 1/2 acres part of tract of William Roberts at mouth of a large spring branch above the said mills; corner to Robert's survey.

Deeds A-1, page 580. April 11, 1803. Stephen Tale sold to John Bailey 87 acres South side of North Fork of Red River as conveyed to the said Tale by Jesse Webb; corner to Jabus Townsend; joins Matthew Alexander's plantation near the old path leads from Harrison's Mills to Hugh McMillen's old place striking said bluff running north.

Deed Book A-1, page 101. John Baily sold Peyton Nowlin for 160 pounds 200 acres North East side of Maulding's Fork of Red River corner to Wm. Harris and on Wm. Harrison's and John Malley's (probably Maulding) line and also corner to Jesse Webb and Jabus Townsend.

Deed Book A-1, page 354. March 16, 1801. John Bailey and Jabus Townsend sold to Jesse Webb for 60 pounds 60 acres on South side of the Far Fork of Red River, also 27 acres belonging to Townsend.

The Will of Anaphilda Townsend is recorded in Logan County, Kentucky, in Will Book A, page 224. Aug. 9, 1798. Probated Dec. 2, 1818. Legatees, sons Thomas, Benjamin, Jabus, Light. Daughters named Delilah Smith's heirs, Didamia Webb, Betsy Nowlin, Lucy Nowlin. Executor Thomas Townsend. Witnessed by Joseph Anthony and _____ Turner and Lewis Read. Wm. Ship and Jno Foley.

Book B of Wills, page 73. Will of Jabus Townsend, January 28, 1817. Proved November 1817. Legatees named wife Mary. Sons William, Thomas, John, Bailey, Jabus, Stephen, Greenberry, Allen and James M. Townsend. Daughters Nancy, Anna and Lucy Townsend.

Logan County, Kentucky, Marriages also show:

William Townsend and Polly Townsend August 18, 1814.

The Webbs and the Townsends intermarried and this branch of the Webb family moved into Warren and White Counties, later in DeKalb County, Tennessee, where they intermarried with the Cantrell family.

THE DAVIE FAMILY

One William Davie, a miller by trade prior to the year 1747 immigrated from Wales (England) with his sweetheart, Lady Mary Ashburn or Osburn, a daughter of his employer, and was married in the colonies of America. It has been said that this marriage took place at Annapolis, Maryland, however, no written record has been found to substantiate this.

They settled on the Potomac River where Washington, D. C. was subsequently located, and remained there until a while before the Revolution in the Colonies. Then fearing the English might find out their locality they leased their lands to some person for 99 years, as the colonist, under the law, could not sell their holdings.

They then moved south to the Colony of the Carolinas, thinking no doubt they would be safer there than on the Potomac from capture of the irate family Ashburn's/Osburn's. I have read somewhere that a brother of Lady Mary Ashburn was dispatched by her family in England at around the time of the Revolutionary War to come to the colonies, find his sister (who had no doubt ran off with Mr. Davie to be married in the colonies) and bring her back to Wales.

However, after arriving in the colonies, it is said that he became ill and died before his mission was accomplished. He was at that time an officer in the British forces. This brother, however, did father a child or some children in the colonies prior to his death, as I have corresponded with one of his descendants who now lives in California. This descendant knows the family name to be Ashburn as opposed to Osburn which was later written in texts.

William and Lady Mary raised a large family of sons and daughters, among them John, Sam, William, Gabriel, and Ashburn. William and Sam remained in Person County, N. C. Some of the others moved to the gold fields of Georgia and fought in the Revolution. William and Lady Mary lived in Person County, N. C. until their deaths (dates unknown) and were then returned to their estate near Washington, D. C. where they were buried.

My family branch continues with Ashburn Davie, who had a son named Gabriel. Gabriel's son William married Peggy Jones, daughter of Major Ambrose Jones and Elizabeth Bumpass, and here starts the known lineage of the Kentucky Davie's. William and Peggy Davie were married in 1783 in N. C. Children included Catherine, Gabriel, Ambrose, Elizabeth, William B. (my great-great grandfather), Sarah Ann, Nancy M., Margaret, Mary A., and Jones. (I have dates on these children should anyone be interested, however, I believe them all to have been born in N. C., several of them coming to Trigg and Christian County, Ky., where they are buried.)

William B. Davie was born in Person County, N. C. February 17, 1791. He married Mary B. Pool on November 1, 1832 in Kentucky. Mary B. was the daughter of Burgess and Sarah (Clardy) Pool who are buried in Trigg County, Kentucky. Children of this marriage were William Warren, Kendal Burgess, Gabriel Jones (my great-grandfather), Ambrose, Jr. (named after his Uncle Ambrose, who also settled in Christian County, Kentucky), Andrew Jackson, Thomas Gill, Sarah Ann, James Marion. (See Bible record at end of this article for dates of these children.)

My records show Gabriel Jones Davie to have been born in Montgomery County, Tennessee on March 9, 1836. I believe after their marriage, William B. and Mary (Pool) Davie moved to Montgomery County, Tenn. where it is known they owned a vast amount of land. Probably the majority of their children were born there, and both of them are believed to have been buried there.

Gabriel Jones Davie married first Sallie D. Rives (Reeves-Reaves) of Trigg County, Kentucky. After the marriage, he went to Arkansas in 1860, enlisted in Company C. of the Confederate Army, Second Arkansas Mounted Infantry in 1861 under McCullough, and went to Corinth in 1862. He was at the Reorganization after Second Corinth and was Captain of Company B, Second Kentucky. He was wounded with two sabre strokes at Elkhorn, received a shotgun wound at Oak Hill on Wilson Creek, and surrendered under Taylor in Louisiana. (He was a graduate of the University of North Carolina with a degree in Civil Engineering.)

It is said that he went through the Civil War, never knowing until his return to Clarksville, Tennessee that his wife had given birth to a son during his absence. When he rode up to their estate on his return home, he was greeted by one of the slaves, who held by the hand a small boy. Capt. Davie questioned the slave as to the identity of the boy, and was told "Masta, Sir, he'd yours." This son, James Mack Davie had been born on August 17, 1861 near Clarksville.

On May 12, 1863, his wife, Sallie, died, leaving him with the small boy.

In 1874 Gabriel Jones Davie married Dora Goodlow and they came to Marshall, Texas by boat bringing the 12 or 13 year old boy with them. They then traveled overland in an ox-drawn wagon to Nevada, Texas. Several children were born of this marriage, all of them in Texas.

Upon the death of his second wife, Gabe Jones took a third and final wife, Flora Bell Sheppard of Quachita Parish, Louisiana (my great-grandmother). Several children were born of this marriage. They lived in Nevada, Texas until both their deaths. He died January 18, 1907. She preceded him in death on November 10, 1893.

Jane were moved to the Powell Cemetery Lafayette, Kentucky.

(page 27) William Cole vs Willie Yarborough & others March Term 1818

Be it remembered that...on the 22nd day of February 1815 was filed in the Clerk's office of this Court a Bill of Complaint...of William Cole Complainant against Willie Yarborough, Sally Yarborough, Edward Yarborough, Nancy Yarborough and Henry Pugh defendants. ...Your orator William Cole of the County of Prince Ann in the Commonwealth of Virginia that on the 14th day of January in the year of our Lord 1793 the State of North Carolina by a grant numbered with the number 1554 granted to Edward Yarborough a tract of land of 3840 acres described in said grant as follows...lying and being in the County of Sumner on the South side of Cumberland near the head of the second creek below Obed River about four or five miles from Cumberland beginning at a poplar & walnut trees, thence North 700 poles to an Ash, thence West eight hundred & seventy seven poles to a Hickory, thence South 700 poles to a stake, thence East 877 poles to the beginning; and the said Edward Yarborough on the 27th March in the year of Our Lord 1800 for the consideration of Two Thousand dollars to him in paid by deed of bargain and sale duly executed for the purpose but not as yet legally registered in the proper county conveyed to William Cole of Prince George but now deceased all the said land by the same description to hold to him and his heirs forever, and afterwards..in the month of May in the Year of Our Lord 1804 the said William Cole last mentioned died leaving an only son, William Cole, your orator, and no other child nor the descendant of any, leaving also a wife, Ann Cole, and a last Will and Testament whereby he devised his whole estate real and personal to his said widow & child and she conveyed the same in fee to her said child, your orator..William Cole.

Also the said Edward Yarborough deceased sometime in the Year of Our Lord 1806 without disposing of said land in his will to any person whomsoever and leaving the following children: Willie Yarborough of the County of Orrange in the State of North Carolina; Sally Yarborough an infant under the age of twentyone years of the same place; Edward Yarborough an infant under the age of twenty one years of the same place and Nancy Yarborough an infant under the age of 21 years of the same place.

Your orator shewith to your Honors that the said lands could not be found and legal evidence thereof being adduced and laid before the Commissioners of the land Office for West Tennessee, they issued a certificate for the whole of said lands but in the name of William Yarborough a foresaid from him to the said William Cole having note been registered at the time of the adjudication whereby your orator is advised that the lands to be appropriated thereby could no otherwise be entered than in the name of the said Edward Yarborough. And your orator sheweth that under and by vertue of said certificate divers tracts of land have ben entered and granted by this State to the said Edward Yarborough and devers others have been entered and not granted to him.

That is to say 300 acres have been entered and granted to the said Edward Yarborough by grant No. 1293 dated the 3rd day of July 1809 butted and bounded as follows..situated, lying and being in the County of Stewart in the first District on the north side of the Cumberland River, and on the Waters of the West Fork of Red River, beginning on the north side of a branch leading down the Green Tree Grove on three White Oak Saplings, thence East 300 poles crossing said branch to Henry Pugh's 520² acre? (blot) entry to two black oak saplings, thence south with said line 160 poles to a stake, thence west (blot... here is something written above this line in fine script but can not read the microfilm copy. Perhaps it is clearer in the original copy) to the beginning including Samuel Walkers improvements. Entered the 12th day of August 1808.

Also 1800 acres entered and granted in the name of the said Edward Yarborough No. of Warrent? (blot) 1293 and dated the 3 Day of July 1809 butted and bounded as follows..in the County of Stuart in the first district on the north side of Cumberland River on the Waters of the Piney Fork of Red River, beginning at two black oaks 80 poles in a South east direction from Barnets house from thence north 550 poles crossing creek to two post oaks, thence west 523 poles and $3/4$ to a post oak, thence south 550 poles to a White Oak thence East 533 poles and $3/4$ crossing a creek to the beginning including Barnets and two springs. Entered the 12th day of August 1808. Part of this land is covered by an older and better title of John McNairy Esq. which interference when taken out of and from said 1800 acres leaves for the said grantee 1351 $1/2$ acres butted and bounded as follows:

Beginning at two Red Oaks runing north five hundred and fifty poles to three post oaks thence west 360 poles to McNairy's line of grant No 3255, thence south with McNairy's line 426 poles to his corner, thence West 160 poles to Yarborough's line of Grant No. 1293 thence south 114 poles to the corner of Yarborough's 1293, thence east to the beginning. The amount of said interference is 448 acres and one half.

Also another tract of 1500 acres entered and granted in the name of said Edward Yarborough by No. of Grant 1441 dated the second day of August 1809 in Stewart County in the first district on the North side of Cumberland River and on the waters of the Little West Fork of Red River begining at three white oaks the northwest corner of Samuel Walkers ocupant claim runing west 400 poles to a black oak waters of Saline Creek, Thence south 600 poles to two black oaks and a white oak, thence east 400 poles to a white oak, thence north 600 poles to the begining & entered on the 8th day of September 1808.

Also another tract of one hundred acres entered and granted in the name of said Edward Yarborough by grant No. 1442 dated 2d day of August 1809 butted and bounded as follows..in Stuart County in the first distript on the north side of Cumberland River and on the waters of the Saline and Dyer's Creek 160 poles north of a 1500 acre tract located for said Yarborough on said waters, beginning in the line of said 1500 acres surveyed in this west boundary 150 poles north of the south east corner of said tract at a dogwood running west 100 $3/4$ poles to a white oak thence south 150 poles to a black oak, thence east 100 poles and $3/4$ to two black oaks and a white oak, thence north 150 poles to the beginning. Entered the 8th day of September 1808.

Also another tract of one hundred and forty acres entered but not granted, which entry is made in the office of the principal surveyor for the first surveyors district in this state and is dated June 6th 1812 and in the words and figures following "Edward Yarborough by virtue of a certificate warrant number 1040 issued by the Register of West Tennessee for 140 acres enters one hundred and forty acres of land in Stuart County on the head waters of Saline Creek north of Dunns. Beginning at a black oak marked H in the east boundary line of 100 tract granted to said Yarborough running north thence east and south for compliment also another tract of 448 acres and a half entered but not granted which entry is made in the same office and is dated the 7th of October 1814 and is in the words and figures following..."Edward Yarborough by virtue of a certificate Warrant No. 13501 issued by the Commissioners of West Tennessee for 448 acres and one half enters 448 1/2 acres of land in (blot. Stuart...?) County on the North side of Cumberland River, beginning on a Red Oak the South west corner of 1500 acres granted to Edward Yarborough and runs east and south to join old line for complement.

Your orator sheweth unto your Honor that all the said Land do in Equity belong to your orator. But the said children of the said Edward Yarborough are so circumstanced by their distant situation, ages and connexions that your orator cannot obtain from them any conveyance for said land which will be valid in Law and your orator is advised that he is able to obtain relief in this honorable court by a decree vesting all the said land in him and his heirs forever.

To the end therefore that the children and heirs above named of the said Edward Yarborough and sd Henry Pugh may answer all and singular the premises on oath and that the said lands and every part thereof already granted may be vested with the title thereof in fee in your orator, and that the said land entered as aforesaid and not granted may when granted be declared by a decree of this Honorable Court to be in Law the lands of your orator in fee and that the legal title hereto when so granted shall be vested in your orator... J. Haywood for the Complainant.

At July Term 1815 Order for publication & Bill amended by making Henry Pugh a Deft.

At January Term 1816 the original Defend'ts failing to appear taken pro confesso as against them. At the same term on motion of the complainant by his consell John Minor appointed Guardian pendente litee for Willie, Sally, Edward and Nancy Yarborough and the order pro confesso set aside and to answer by their said guardian.

The answer of Henry Pugh (filed the 24th January 1816) to the Bill of Complaint of William Cole, complainant against Willie Yarborough, Sally Yarborough, Nancy Yarborough, & Henry Pugh defendants. This defendant saith that he believes that all the facts contained in the complainants bill are true and furthermore he saith that he was employed by the guardian of the said complainant during his minority to locate said land for which he was to receive a reward, and that he has caused said land to be surveyed & granted except the tract of one hundred & forty acres which is surveyed but not granted and since the said William Cole the complainant in this Bill has come to this county and made an agreement with your orator concerning his services which

agreement is in substance as follows..."The said William Cole the complainant in this Bill did execute a bond to your orator agreeing to convey in fee to your orator the following tracts of land as your Orators services for locating the said lands. One tract of three hundred acres of land beginning at three white oaks or post oaks in the Barnens the north east corner of one thousand five hundred acres granted to Edward Yarborough & runs east three hundred poles thence south one hundred & sixty poles thence west three hundred poles thence north to the beginning. Also one other tract of land containing four hundred & twelve acres to begin at the said three white oaks the beginning corner of one thousand five hundred acres granted to Edward Yarborough & is a part of the same and runs west as as to strike Elliotts east boundary line & with his line South in all six hundred poles, thence east to the south east corner of said tract of one thousand five hundred acres thence north six hundred poles to the beginning.

So soon as the said complainant can obtain a decree in his favour for the same land vesting the title thereof in him, the defendant is willing that the decree prayed for by the complainant against the other defendants to this bill shall be made by this honorable Court provided the Equity of this defendant be secured thereby. Hugh Pugh.

Sworn to Jany 24th 1816 before John Minor Clerk.

Replication to the foregoing filed 29th Jany 1816.

The answer of Willie Yarborough, Sally Yarborough, Nancy Yarborough, and Edward Yarborough infants under the age of Twenty One years by them their guardian John Minor to a Bill in Equity exhibitted in the Supreme Court of Errors & Appeal against them and Henry Pugh by William Cole. Filed 24th July 1816.

These defendants say that they believe it to be true that their father Edward Yarborough did on the 27th March 1800 by deed dated on that day and here exhibitted marked "A" convey to one William Cole then of the County of Prince in the State of Virginia but now deceased a tract of land containing three thousand eight hundred and forty acres situated and lying in the County of Summer in this State on the South side of Cumberland River near the head of the second Creek below Obeds River about four or five miles from Cumberland....as stated in said Bill of Complaint, granted to Edward Yarborough their father by grant No 1554 dated the 14th day of January 1793 from the State of North Carolina....they also agree that sometime in the year 1804 the said William Cole departed this life leaving a son William Cole..they know not whether he left anothe child or not....they..admit..first William Cole..left a wife Ann Cole and a last Will and Testament, but know nothing of the contents of that will or disposition of William Coles estate by his wife Anne. They further admit that their father.. Edward Yarborough departed this life sometime in the year 1806 and do not know of his having made any disposition of said land..conveyed to William Cole..... They further admit that the said three thousand eight hundred and forty acres of land could not be identified and that the Commissioners either for East or West Tennessee issued a certificate or certificates for the same which has been located at the times and on the places ...as stated..and that grants have issued in the

name of..Edward Yarborough for the most of said land if not all. As to any other charges in said Bill they know nothing. John Minor Clerk.

And now at the present term final decree was had thereon as follows...

This cause having regularly come on to be heard before the Honorable Robert White & Archibald Roane Esquires Judges was accordingly heard on the 13th March 1818...it appearing to the satisfaction of the court that grant was made to Edward Yarborough by State of North Carolina on date, etc. as previously stated...lying in Sumner Co., etc..... that on 27 March 1800 was conveyed by deed to William Cole of Prince George County...that he has since departed this life and it appears to the court that the complainant by virtue of the last Will and Testament of said William Cole Dec'd is entitled to have the land.

It further appearing to the court that the said Edward Yarborough.. in the year 1806 departed this life aforesaid Willie, Sally, Edward, and Nancy his only heirs & Representatives. If further appears to the satisfaction of the Court that the land could not be identified and that the Commissioners of the land office of West Tennessee issued a certificate for the whole of said land but in consequence of the deed aforesaid not being duly registered before their adjudication certificates did not issue to said Cole but said Yarborough and the following grants issued from this state in the name of said Edward Yarborough.. 300 acres by grant 1292 dated the 3rd day of July 1809 (as described previously)....also another tract of 1800 acres no. 1293 dated 3rd day July 1809 (as described previously)...also another tract of 1500 acres entered and granted in the name of the said Yarborough No. 1441 dated the 2d day of August 1809..(as described previously)....also another tract of 100 acres entered and granted in the name of Edward Yarborough by Grant No. 1442 dated the 2d day of August 1809 ...(as previously described).

It further appears to the Court that there is one other tract of land entered by said Yarborough but not granted of 140 acres which entry is made in the Office of the Principal Surveyor for the first surveyors district in this State and dated June 6th 1812..(as previously described)..also another tract of 448 acres entered but not granted... dated 7 October 1814...(as described)....

It further appears to the satisfaction of the court that Henry Pugh one of the Defendants by virtue of his agreement with the complainant for services for locating the aforesaid tracts of land was entitled to the following tract One tract of 300 acres of land beginning at three white oaks or post oaks in the Barrens ..(as described)...also another tract of 412 acres of land ..(as described).... Wherefore it is ordered adjudged and decreed that all the title both legal and equitable of all the tracts of said land herein recited be and is here by divested from the defendants and their heirs who are heirs at Law ...of said Edward Yarborough and that the same shall and hereby are vested in the said William Cole his heirs and assigns forever subject as to the said lands above mentioned which are above stated to have been contracted to be allowed to the said Henry Pugh to all Equity and equitable estate and claim that he or his assigns now have therein.

And further it is decreed that the Complainant pay the cost of this suit....

ROBERT SINGLETON -- Revolutionary War

While a resident of Guilford County, North Carolina, Robert Singleton enlisted in the spring of 1776, and served one year as a private in Captain John Nelson's company in Colonel Polk's 4th North Carolina regiment. He returned home and in about one month was commissioned ensign in Captain Andrew Vancy's company in Colonel Abraham Shepard's 10th North Carolina regiment and continued in the service until sometime in 1779. He moved to Georgia and was in service there in pursuit of Indians. He lost the sight of his right eye in a skirmish from the gun of the man who stood next to him in the rank.

He moved to Tennessee and on May 2, 1818 was living in Montgomery Co., Tennessee where he applied for his pension. At that time he was in his seventy-fifth year.

He mentions in his application that he had two daughters, one with four children, whose husband was killed at New Orleans in the "late war". Names of the children and grandchildren are not stated. He does not mention his wife at any time.

He died in late 1820 or early 1821 as his pension ceased on January 31, 1821. His pension amounted to \$8.00 per month.

SAMUEL CALDWELL -- War of 1812

Samuel Caldwell was born in Virginia in 1776. The Caldwell family came to Tennessee in 1806. Samuel Caldwell married Nancy Howell who was born in Tennessee in 1804 and died in 1856. Samuel Caldwell died in 1840.

Their son Samuel A. Caldwell was born November 10, 1825. In 1841 he clerked in a store in Palmyra and was there for seven years. He went into the lumber business, but lost more than \$2000 worth of lumber, which was used in the construction of Fort Donelson. He married M. A. Neblett in 1857, the daughter of Dr. Neblett. They had five children: Richard D., Mary C., Lucy V., Hart M., and Cora L.
